## Choosing the right dog breed

The most commonly chosen pet is the dog. They are wonderful creatures, think of the guide dogs, how much help they are to their owners! They can be taught to do so much. Depending on their breed, they can live from 10 to 19 years, with the smallest breeds ranging from 1 to 3 kg in adult size (e.g. Yorkshire terriers). The largest can reach 60 to 80 kg in adult size, such as German dogs and Bernathorns. Their nature varies greatly from breed to breed and from sex to sex. A more relaxed breed, which can be settled with little exercise: the French Bulldog. Dogs full of energy and playfulness that need a lot of exercise: the Hungarian vizsla. Cooperative, easy to teach: the Poodle. Stubborn, harder to handle: terriers.

Consider your own physical condition! Choose a dog that does not exceed your strength! As he matures, he may be frightened by something or something tempting to him and want to run away, you may need physical strength in addition to command to stop him. Think about what your nature is like! If you are calm, you will be disturbed by an excitable dog. And if you are energetic, a calm, slower dog will be harder to get along with.

Consider how much room for manoeuvre you will have in your home. If you have a yard, you can choose a medium or larger dog. It can live outside in the yard, but it can also be kept inside or outside - when the family is not at home, it can guard the house outside, and when you are home, it can go inside.

Don't lock an energetic, active dog in a tiny flat all day, as it will feel unwell, and will chew and destroy things to keep itself from getting bored.

Only choose a purebred dog from a breeder! You can change a rescued dog's fate for the better by taking it home. Visit a shelter! There are many aspects to consider! Never choose based on how cute he is as a puppy! Puppies a few weeks old can fit in your hand, but they can grow to be huge by the time they are 1.5 years old. Think carefully about your choice, because in a lucky scenario they could be your companion for up to 19 years! Think about how old you are now, your dog could live with you for twice as long as you have!
