I. Appendix

Competing dogs – Sport allows dogs to make use of their natural abilities. It also provides them with mental stimulation and strengthens the bond between humans and dogs.

Dog dancing is much more than just wagging tails to music. It is a sport of extraordinary cooperation, where the dog and its owner move in perfect harmony and perform spectacular routines to music.

When it comes to disc dogs, or dogs that fetch frisbees, there are two possible outcomes: either the dog with the most spectacular catch (which usually involves jumps and somersaults) or the dog that catches the frisbee from the furthest distance wins.

Fast and brave dogs race down a runway and jump over water until they can bring back a toy — this is a sport called dock diving. A legendary dog named Sounders set the world record for the longest dog jump in 2022, at 11.12 metres. That's longer than the length of a London bus!

In sheepdog trials, dogs are tested on their herding skills. Following commands, they must herd sheep through an obstacle course and into a pen with the utmost precision.

Abbie and dogs like her have given new meaning to the term "dog swimming". She was the first dog to be inducted into the International Surfing Hall of Fame.

Shadow holds the record for the deepest dive by a dog, at four metres, while Bellybutton was able to dive more than six metres without breathing.

In agility competitions, humans guide dogs through a complex obstacle course that includes sharp turns, tunnels and seesaws.
